WEEKEND OVERVIEW

Alumnae Weekend 2024 begins on Friday, April 19. Next, take a peek into the Agnes Scott curriculum with Back to Class sessions then enjoy social interaction with faculty members during the Meet the Faculty reception. These experiences will remind you why Agnes Scott remains among the best—and most innovative—colleges in the nation. Close out the evening with celebrations across campus, organized by generation. This evening, especially, is the time to encourage friends from adjacent class years to join the fun.
